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SCHEDULE

Mon/Wed&Mon/Wed/Fri (Ages 4 & 5*)
Tuesdays & Thursdays (Ages 3 & 4*)
Children must be age eligible to register for either class. Age 3 for the Tu/Th and Age 4 for the M/W & M/W/F respectively.

Start Date: Sept. 10 & 11, 2012-June 2013

BTAC follows RSU 21's school schedule including vacations, holidays & snow days. If school is cancelled due to inclement weather, BTAC is closed.

*Ages are the age your child is on 10/15/2012.

PROGRAM FEES

Participants may choose from a 2-or 3-day program. The cost of the 2-day program is \$730 for Kennebunk residents and \$780 for non-residents. The cost of the 3-day program is \$1130 for Kennebunk residents & \$1210 for non-residents. Parents may pay the entire cost of the program at registration, or choose to divide the cost into ten equal installments of \$73 or \$78 respectively for the 2-day program or \$113 or \$121 respectively for the 3-day program due on the first of each month with the first and last payments due at registration.

ARRIVALS

BTAC's hours are M/W/F 9am to 12 noon and T/T 9-11:45am. Doors do not open until 9am; coordinators arrive earlier but are busy preparing for the day's activities. Transitioning from home to preschool can be a challenge for children (and parents). Please remember we are here to assist you and your child during this process. If your child will be arriving late or will be

If your child will be arriving late or will be absent for the day, we request you notify us. Children (and coordinators) wonder and worry about their friends who are late or ill. Your call will allow us to share appropriate information with your child's friends.

REFUND POLICY

A \$50 fee will be deducted from refund per child if canceled before October 1, 2012. After October 1st a two week notice is required of all participants leaving BTAC prior to end of the program. The date of the last day your child will be considered in this program will be two weeks after the department is notified by the parent/guardian that they would like to take their child out of BTAC and be granted a refund. At that time a prorated refund of the number of weeks remaining in this program will be calculated by the department and mailed out to you. Please be aware that it may take 2-3 weeks after cancellation to receive the refund check. If you would like to take your child out of BTAC, you MUST contact Kennebunk Recreation office, 604-1335 or stop by the office on the Town

Hall.third floor. There is no refund if a child should be dismissed from the Program for disciplinary reasons.

LATE OR NON-PAYMENT

This program relies on the program fees of its participants to continue operating. Late or non-payments for this program may result in your child not being allowed to attend BTAC. Late payment fees are as follows: If not received within 5 days of due date, an additional fee of \$10 will be charged. If not received within 8 days of due date, the late fee will increase to \$20 and your child may not participate in this program until the balance is fully paid.

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

Beyond Tots Adventure Club seeks to provide all children with a safe, nurturing first experience away from home. The program encourages social interaction and the development of positive self-esteem through a variety of hands-on, developmentally appropriate experiences. Activities include: projects, arts and crafts, music, dance, exercise, movement, cooking, blocks, games, and field trips. We will provide a place where your child can have fun, make friends, and maybe learn along the way. Play is also an integral part of the day, as it is through indoor and outdoor play that children learn about the world and their place in it. Children are supported and encouraged as they interact in a variety of small and large group activities.

A TYPICAL DAY AT BTAC

9:00-10:00am **Choice Time:** includes individual greetings, getting belongings settled into cubbies, 'good-byes', free play from a variety of centers: blocks, art, dramatic play, manipulative play, and book, & clean-up

10:15-10:30am **Circle Time:** includes group greetings, discussion of the morning's theme/activities, movement, songs, stories, finger plays, etc.

10:30-11:00am **Snack:** practice self-help skills to prepare space and self for snack time, eating snack, socializing, & clean-up

11:00-11:45am or 11:00-11:30 **Outdoor Play:** We are fortunate to be located at the Youth Comm. Center, Park Street so children may take full advantage of the Harbor playground. Additional activities may include a variety of outdoor games, nature explorations, bubble blowing and outdoor art activities.

11:30-11:45 or 11:45-12:00 noon **Closing Circle Time:** After returning from outdoors, children will begin the process of transitioning from school to home. This circle will include a discussion of the morning's events & upcoming events, stories, songs, finger plays, etc.

11:45 am **OR** 12:00 Noon **Dismissal**

*The time frames noted may be adjusted to reflect the interests and needs of the children.

DISMISSALS

Please be at the classroom door no later than 11:45/noon to pick up your child. Children must be picked up by a parent, guardian, or an individual on the signed authorization form. A child may not be released to anyone without authorization.

LATE PICK-UP POLICY

Late pick-ups are emotionally difficult for children & staff. The time spent waiting to be picked up can seem like an eternity to a child who is wondering why his/her care giver hasn't arrived. Please call if you find yourself in a situation where you will be late. The late policy for Kennebunk Recreation BTAC is as follows: ~10-15 mins, late \$10

~15-30 mins. late \$15:

~Over 30 mins late \$30

If the participant's parent/guardian or adult approved to pick up the child is late in picking up their child 2 times throughout the duration of the program &/or more than 40 minutes late at any time, a meeting will be set up with the Director to discuss if the participant will be allowed to continue the program. Your child will not be allowed back into the program until this meeting has occurred and a determination is made.

THEMES/ACTIVITIES

Because we encourage the natural creativity and curiosity of children, we do not use the themes of superheroes or TV shows. Toy weapons are not used at BTAC.

TOILETING

Children must be independently toilet trained to attend BTAC.

TREASURES FROM HOME/SHARING DAY

While we do not wish to dampen your child's enthusiasm to share, please do not allow your child to bring toys or objects to BTAC. Treasures can be lost or broken. There are two exceptions to this rule. First, each child will have the opportunity to share a special item when it is his/her turn for "Sharing Day". (Look for the Sharing Bag in your child's cubby). Secondly, your child is encouraged to bring any type of interesting specimen/object (i.e. rocks, shells, flowers) that may enhance our current theme. Please discuss this with us in advance so we can plan accordingly.

SNACK

Please send a nutritious snack and beverage each day. To avoid confusion at snack time, mark each snack and drink container clearly with your child's name. While the sharing of snacks is discouraged, there may be occasions when we will share a group snack. For example, an apple activity may include making applesauce. Children may also wish to share a special treat to celebrate their birthday (or ½ birthday if their birthday is during the summer months).

FOOD ALLERGIES

Please let us know if your child has a food allergy. This is extremely important so that we can plan safe food activities and alert other BTAC families to be vigilant if necessary.

CLOTHING

BTAC is an active, hands-on environment. This means your child will get dirty and messy. Please send your child to preschool in washable clothes that won't restrict her/his full participation in our activities. All children should have a complete change of clothes available at BTAC (including underwear). Clear containers are provided on the top of your child's cubby for storage. Please write your child's name on all clothing (including hats, mittens and coats). Maine is a state prone to rapid weather changes. The only time we do not go outside is in extreme weather. Please be sure to dress your child in clothes that are appropriate for the season & weather. Layered clothing tends to be the best approach to our varied temperatures. Clothing that is easy on-off & properly sized makes everybody's job a lot easier.

COMMUNICATION

We look forward to getting to know and communicating with parents throughout the year. We encourage your questions, ideas and concerns. Methods of communication may include newsletters, posted information, notes, conversations, and/or telephone calls and/or email correspondence. Arrivals and dismissals are busy times for everyone at BTAC. Please understand that while we may not have an opportunity to engage in lengthy conversations at this time, we are interested in what you have to say. Don't hesitate to ask for an opportunity to talk at a less hectic time.

GUIDANCE / DISCIPLINE

Guidance/discipline is a gradual process requiring that the adults in a child's life model good behaviors and be warm, loving, firm, consistent and patient in the process of setting limits. Guidance/ discipline, if understood in this context, would never result in the child feeling humiliated, hopeless about improving, manipulated or over controlled, but would rather increase the child's self esteem and self direction. At BTAC. children are expected to observe important, simple rules such as, respecting their peers & adults, observing safety regulations, and participating in activities that support the group (i.e. picking up toys). They are not allowed to harm others, BTAC property or themselves. Ongoing and/or significant guidance issues will be discussed with parents. A variety of developmentally appropriate methods is used to address guidance issues. Typical guidance techniques are redirection, age appropriate discussions of the issue, age appropriate problem solving, etc. A quiet area will be available for children who would like to "take a break" or "think about things".

FIELD TRIPS

BTAC program participants will be scheduled for 2-3 driving field trips (i.e. orchard, pumpkin farm) per year. Additional walking trips to local sites will be planned according to curriculum themes and weather conditions


HEALTH

If your child is not feeling well, please do not send them to BTAC. Children who are ill cannot fully participate in the BTAC day and deserve more attention and care than we are able to provide. It is always best to err on the side of caution when faced with a potentially sick child. Allow her/him to remain at home. Communicable illnesses are common among young children and can spread quickly in a group setting. BTAC appreciates your assistance in keeping all our children (and staff) healthy. In keeping with the guidelines set forth by the Center for Disease Control, children experiencing the following health issues should be kept home:

- *Fever-AND sore throat, rash, vomiting, diarrhea, earache, irritability, or confusion. *Fever is defined as having a temperature of 100°F or higher taken under the arm,
 - 101°F taken orally, or 102°F taken rectally
- Diarrhea--runny, watery, or bloody stools
- *Vomiting--2 or more times in a 24-hour period
- *Body rash with fever
- *Sore throat with fever and swollen glands
- *Severe coughing--child gets red or blue in the face or makes high-pitched whooping sound after coughing
- *Eye discharge--thick mucus or pus draining from the eye, or pink eye
- Yellowish skin or eyes
- •Child is irritable, continuously crying, and requires more attention than BTAC can provide without hurting the health and safety of other children

We do not administer any medicine, prescription or non-prescription, to children. Cough drops are a potential choking hazard for young children and should remain at home.

We do advocate proper procedures for hygeine, such as coughing or sneezing into your arm, not your open hand. This reduces transmission of germs.
